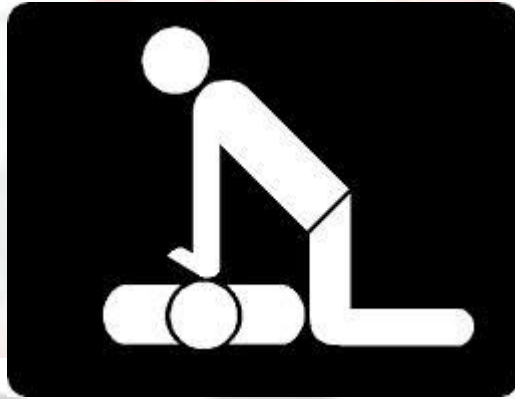
# Celebrate Success?
